Class Description and Materials

Skill Level: Beginning Knitter

Skills Taught: Linen Stitch

Prerequisite Skills: Basic Knitting Skills: Casting On, Knitting, Purling, Increases, Decreases and Binding Off

Location/Date/Time: Yarn Expressions;

Sunday November 18th from 4 to 6:30pm.

Fee: **\$30.00** plus materials. Please try to purchase your yarn before the workshop date so that any hank yarns can be wound into balls for your use at the beginning of class. Registered students receive a **10 percent discount** on all class tools and materials.

Description: This is a stitch pattern-oriented workshop. Students will learn how to create this scarf using the decorative linen stitch.

Materials List:

Yarn: Approximately 600 yards of any variegated sock yarn. Pattern was written for Shibui Staccato Sock yarn but any other comparable weight yarn is suitable.

Needles: US Size 6 knitting needles. Circular or straight needles may be used.

Tools: Scissors or snips, tapestry needle, pen or pencil & paper to take notes.
