

Tri-Loom Weaving

Class Description and Materials List



Learn How to Weave on a Tri-Loom

Skill Level: *Beginner.*

Skills Taught in Class: Learn the basics of Tri-Loom weaving. This is an introductory class; participants will learn the basic techniques and create a simple woven shawlette (with optional fringe) on a 3ft Tri-Loom.

Prerequisite Skills: None

Location/Date/Time: Yarn Expressions; **Saturday November 17th from 4 to 7pm.**

Fee: **\$35.00** plus materials. Basic fixed 3 ft tri-looms will be provided for participant use by the instructor. There will be a \$10.00 loom use fee paid directly to the instructor. Looms may be purchased; the loom use fee will be credited towards the purchase price.

Please try to purchase your yarn before the workshop date so that any hank yarns can be wound into balls for your use at the beginning of class. Registered students receive a **10 percent discount** on all class tools and materials.

If participants express an interest, future sessions in more advanced triloom techniques may be scheduled. We are working to have larger adjustable Tri-Looms made available for sale in the shop as well as advanced Tri-Loom techniques books.

Description This is an introductory class; participants will learn the basic techniques and create a simple woven shawlette on a 3ft Tri-Loom.

Materials List:

Yarn: Approximately 100 yards of any moderately smooth worsted weight (Yarn Code 4) yarn or bulky (Yarn Code 5) yarn in your choice of colors. Fuzzy yarns and ones containing mohair are difficult to weave and are outside the scope of this workshop.

Needles: Some weavers find a medium size crochet hook to be a useful tool. The specific size of hook that will work best depends on the weight of the yarn used and the spacing of the weaving posts on the loom. If you have crochet hooks, bring sizes F, G and H. If you would like to purchase one, please wait until the beginning of class so that the right size can be identified for you.

Tools: Scissors or snips, tapestry needle, pen or pencil & paper to take notes.
